From The Pastor

Dear St. Paul's Friends,

Pastor and preacher, novelist and poet Frederick Beuchner is one of my favorite authors. He has a way of speaking down to earth about heavenly things. He is honest and real when it comes to writing about those things we sometimes put on a pedestal. In particular, he writes about the church and those who for whatever reason expect a perfect church and are sorely disappointed no matter which church they may enter. In a little piece called "Nave," Beuchner gets down to the nitty gritty of church life and rather than turn away in disillusionment he embraces what he finds there, all of it. I offer his "Nave" as food for thought when you wonder about this enterprise we call the church and what it--we--are all about.

Nave

The nave is the central part of the church from the main front to the chancel. It's the part where the laity sit, and in great Gothic churches it's sometimes separated from the choir and clergy by a screen. It takes its name from the Latin navis, meaning "ship," one reason being that the vaulted roof looks rather like an inverted keel. A more interesting reason is that the church itself is thought of as a ship or Noah's ark. It's a resemblance worth thinking about.

In one as in the other, just about everything imaginable is aboard, the clean and the unclean both. They are all piled in together helter-skelter, the predators and the prey, the wild and the tame, the sleek and beautiful ones and the ones that are ugly as sin. There are sly young foxes and impossible old cows. There are the catty and the piggish and the peacock-proud. There are hawks and there are doves. Some are wise as owls, some silly as geese; some meek as lambs and others ravening wolves. There are times when they all cackle and roar and sing together, and there are times when you could hear a pin drop. Most of them have no clear idea just where they're supposed to be heading or how they're supposed to get there or what they'll find if and when they do, but they figure the people in charge must know and in the meanwhile sit back on their haunches and try to enjoy the ride.

It's not all enjoyable. There's backbiting just like everywhere else. There's a pecking order. There's growling and grousing and whining. It's a regular menagerie in there. But even at its worst, there's that one thing that makes it bearable within, and that is the storm without--the wild winds and terrible waves and in all the watery waste, no help in sight.

And if there is never clear sailing, there is at least shelter from the blast, a sense of somehow heading in the right direction in spite of everything, a ship to keep afloat, and, like a beacon in the dark, the hope of finding safe harbor at last.

Wishing you grace, love and peace, and the hope of a safe harbor at last. May God bless us and keep us together as we persevere in Christ's church.
